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the discovery of the importance of sign language in the deaf community is very recent indeed this book provides a study of the communication and culture of deaf people and particularly of the deaf community in Britain the authors principal aim is to inform educators psychologists linguists and professionals working with deaf people about the rich language the

deaf have developed for themselves a language of movement and space of the hands and of the eyes of abstract communication as well as iconic story telling the first chapters of the book discuss the history of sign language use its social aspects and the issues surrounding the language acquisition of deaf children bsl follows and the authors also consider how the signs come into existence change over time and alter their meanings and how bsl compares and contrasts with spoken languages and other signed languages subsequent chapters examine sign language learning from a psychological perspective and other cognitive issues the book concludes with a consideration of the applications of sign language research particularly in the contentious field of education there is still much to be discovered about sign language and the deaf community but the authors have succeeded in providing an extensive framework on which other researchers can build from which professionals can develop a coherent practice for their work with deaf people and from which hearing parents of deaf children can draw the confidence to understand their children s world

shsl and analyze the linguistic functions of non manual markers this systematic investigation not only contributes to our understanding of shsl itself but also informs typological research on sign languages in the world

once signed languages are recognized as natural human languages a world of exploration opens up signed languages provide a powerful tool for investigating the nature of human language and language processing the relation between cognition and language and the neural organization of language the value of sign languages lies in their modality specifically for perception signed languages depend upon high level vision and motion processing systems and for production they require the integration of motor systems involving the hands and face these facts raise many questions what impact does this different biological base have for grammatical systems for online language processing for the acquisition of language how does it affect nonlinguistic cognitive structures and processing are the same neural systems involved these are some of the questions that this book aims at addressing the answers provide insight into what constrains grammatical form language processing linguistic working memory and hemispheric specialization for language the study of signed languages allows researchers to address questions about the nature of linguistic and cognitive systems that otherwise could not be easily addressed
